Introduction

- The Biosafety Clearing-House (BCH) is established in Article 20 of the Protocol
- Parties to the Protocol are required to share certain types of information and decisions via the BCH
 - E.g. decisions on LMOs for intentional introduction into the environment; decisions on domestic use of LMOs that may be subject to transboundary movement for direct use as food or feed, or for processing.
- BCH is free and available to everyone

BCH and Customs Officers

- Most common types of information that customs officers are likely to need to find in the BCH are:
 - Contact information for national authorities
 - National decisions on whether or not the import of specific LMOs is allowed
