Treaty obligation

Article 33. Monitoring and Reporting

Each Party shall monitor the implementation of its obligations under this Protocol, and shall, at intervals to be determined by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to this Protocol, report to the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to this Protocol on measures that it has taken to implement the Protocol.



Important elements of COP-MOP decisions on Reporting

Consultative process

Reports should be prepared through a consultative process involving all relevant government agencies and stakeholders

(Decision BS-I/9 and Decision BS-V/14)

Frequency and deadline

Reports are due every four years

The deadline for submission is one year before the MOP at which they will be considered

(Decision BS-I/9)

Financial support:




Primary objective of reporting requirement

- to assess the overall status of implementation of the Protocol
- to review each Party's compliance with its obligations under the Cartagena Protocol
- to identify issues that impede compliance
- to devise measures that facilitate compliance



Rate of Submission of National Reports: First National Reports




141 Parties obligated to report

Specific purposes of Second National Report

To establish <u>baseline data</u>:

- for the assessment and review process under the Cartagena Protocol (Decision BS-V/15)
- to measure progress in the implementation of the Strategic Plan (Decision BS-V/16)
- > as an information source for the comprehensive review of the Action Plan for Building Capacities for the Effective Implementation of the Protocol

(Decision BS-V/3)



Preparation and submission of Second National Report

- The National Focal Point is expected to initiate and coordinate information gathering and preparation of the national report and ensure its submission
- Deadline for the submission of the Second National Report is 30th
 September 2011
- The Report must be submitted in an official language of the United Nations
- Submission of national report could be effected:
 - Online through the BCH; or
 - > In MS word format as a scanned attachment with signed first page



Preparation and submission of Second **National Report**

Step 1

Download offline the reporting form in MS Word in your preferred language





Step 2

Fill out the offline reporting form through consultative process, as appropriate



Step 3 (by BCH-NFP)

Fill out and submit the online form through the **BCH**


GEF Support for the preparation of Second National Report

- \$ 20,000 grants to assist GEF-eligible Parties in their consultative information-gathering process leading to the preparation and submission of second national reports.
- Three umbrella medium-size projects implemented by UNEP to expedite disbursement
