Part 1: Main Decisions

Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety (Article 23)

Decision BS-II/6, para (d); BS-II/13, p.11:

- Intensify cooperation with the Aarhus Convention on PAP
- Maximize opportunities for cooperation

Decision BS-V/13 para. 1 &3 of, :

- Adopted PoW on PAEP (2011-2015)
- Coherence among the PoW and the Aarhus Convention

Aarhus Convention (the GMO Amendment/Almaty)

<u>Amendment)</u>

Decision II/1:

- Adopted the GMO Amendment
- Cooperate with the Protocol

MOP-4, decision IV/6, including Annex I:

Adopted the work programme (2012–2014)

Part 2: Joint Issues

Goal:

 Public awareness, education and participation, including access to information, on LMOs/GMOs

Challenges:

Article 23 and GMO Amendment implemented

Parties lack:

- Legal frameworks/mechanisms
- Human resources
- Sharing of experiences and resource materials
- Access to information
- Mechanisms/procedures for public participation

Aarhus Convention and Protocol

- Joint workshops, side events, online discussions and round tables with regional/international organizations (e.g. AU, RAIN-AFRICA, ABNE, UNEP-GEF, UNESCO and MEAs)
- Joint educational materials, toolkits/manuals
- Promote access to information by interlinking the clearinghouses
- Joint webinars (online seminars)



Parties and other stakeholders

- Contact focal points of and other experts on the Aarhus Convention
- Use guidance, incl. the Lucca Guidelines, PoW and online forum
- Identify key national NGOs, businesses, academia and media to set up joint national networks/centers to promote PAEP (as Aarhus centers)
- Collaborate with SCBD and regional networks/organizations (e.g. AU, ACB, RAEIN-AFRICA, ABNE, AfricaBio) (e.g. educational packages)
