

Press Brief: COP-MOP 8

4-17 December 2016

Public awareness, education and participation, including access to information, concerning living modified organisms (Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety)

Background

The Protocol requires Parties, to cooperate with other States and international bodies, to promote and facilitate public awareness and education, including access to information, regarding the safe transfer, handling and use of living modified organisms (LMOs). It also requires Parties to consult the public in the decision-making process, to make public the final decision taken and to inform public about the means of access to the Biosafety Clearing-House (BCH).

Key Messages

Parties are implementing a Programme of Work on public awareness, education and participation concerning the safe transfer, handling and use of LMOs. The programme includes four elements: capacity-building, public awareness and education, public access to information and, public participation

- -In the BCH, there is a Public Awareness and Participation Portal, including a number of resources and activities (e.g. online discussions on access to information and public participation regarding LMOs, communication plan template, awareness survey template). - -A Second joint Aarhus Convention/CBD round table on public awareness, access to information and public participation regarding LMOs and genetically modified organisms (GMOs) was held in November 2016, that made some recommendations regarding the Programme of Work on the way forward from the Chair's summary. Work of the Convention on Biological Diversity

At COP-MOP 5, Parties to the Cartagena Protocol adopted a Programme of Work (2011-2015) to facilitate the implementation of Article 23 of the Cartagena Protocol and decided to review the Programme of Work at COP-MOP 8. In this regard, COP-MOP will consider the status of implementation of the Programme of Work, including a number of activities undertaken or facilitated by the Secretariat to assist Parties in implementing the Programme of Work and decide on its future need and/or necessary revisions.

COP-MOP 8 is expected to review the implementation of the Programme of Work and may decide to extend the Programme of Work with a set of priority areas and activities.
