Potential Areas of Intervention

- Stocktaking analysis Review and case studies of enforcement mechanisms from national biosafety systems
- Need for pilot studies/data
- Strengthening capacity for compliance and enforcement [toolkits, training workshops, checklists]







Potential Areas of Intervention [II]

Developing networks for enforcement cooperation; and

Raising awareness of the importance of environmental compliance and enforcement among relevant stakeholders.

Capacity Building issues identified

- Need for long-term training in LMO handling, inspection and monitoring
- Support wherever feasible, existing relevant personnel, such as agricultural inspectors or quarantine officers, environmental/food safety officers, to handle biosafety enforcement instead of training and deploying completely new staff.
- Need for necessary infrastructure & toolkits (e.g., laboratories for LMO testing and identification) to support monitoring and enforcement activities.
